December update to CLG

Cuadrilla update:

- Since the last meeting, we have completed the nitrogen lift welltest activity on PNR2, and
 the well is now shut in to monitor pressure response in the reservoir. Flowtesting
 equipment has now been demobilised from the site, along with much of the supporting
 rental equipment. Annulus pressure monitoring is continuing on both wells in line with our
 procedures and industry practice.
- We are now going through an exercise of consolidating our inventory, so some equipment and materials may be seen moving on and off the site, but this is not linked to any forthcoming well operations.
- The site viewing area has been closed and is no longer accessible to members of the public. In conjunction with the land owner, the area will be restored in the Spring.
- There was an incident of trespass onto the land around the PNR site on 1st December. We were hoping to remove the heras fencing at the front gate commensurate with the risk of obstruction to vehicle movements, however in the light of the incident at the weekend this is now under review.

Environment Agency update:

- Cuadrilla continues to assess the pressure response of the shale reservoir and this is expected to continue for the next 3-6 months.
- While most equipment has now been removed from site, site security will remain.
- Compliance Assessment Forms related to oil & condensate storage and related to the Environmental Management & Monitoring plan are due to be publicly available shortly.
- The Environment Agency's own ambient air monitoring and surface water monitoring is to continue for the foreseeable future.
- The site's rainwater storage reached capacity on 30 September and tankers were needed outside the normal hours of planning permission. We issued a Compliance Assessment Report form on 11 October related to the discharge of treated surface water. A discharge was made on 15 and 16 October.

Health and Safety Executive update:

- The Health and Safety Executive (HSE) remains satisfied that there are currently no well integrity issues at PNR-1z or PNR-2.
- HSE have received Cuadrilla's material change to their notification with details of their plans for suspension of wells PNR-1z and PNR-2, and Cuadrilla have confirmed that both wells are

now suspended. Annulus monitoring will continue to take place during the suspension period.

Lancashire Police update:

• In line with the reduction of activity at the site, both by Cuadrilla and campaigners, our staffing numbers have been reduced again to a small team of Police Liaison Officers and two other officers. Following the removal of the gate camp over the weekend these numbers will be reduced further. We will be liaising with LCC with the aim of returning to a state of normality including removing of Heras fencing at the site entrance and the reinstatement of the 50mph limit on Preston New Road. There have been no arrests since the last meeting and no new formal complaints made to police.
